German painter/poet/musician Emil Schult — a frequent collaborator with pioneering electronic band Kraftwerk — performs Saturday at Florida SouthWestern State College.

The Dusseldorf-based Schult plays at the college's Bob Rauschenberg Gallery with opening act Sonic Combine, which features Emmy Award-winning local flutist Kat Epple. The free show starts at 1 p.m. Saturday.

Schult co-wrote lyrics to some of Kraftwerk's most famous songs, including "Autobahn," "Radio-Activity," "Trans-Europe Express" and "The Model." He also occasionally sang and played guitar with the band and designed most of its album sleeves and the images projected during its concerts.

Saturday is also the last day of the Rauschenberg Gallery exhibit "Dave Muller: Everything Sounds Good Right Now."
