

Rauschenberg Gallery Hosts Acclaimed Artist White beginning Sept. 11

FORT MYERS — The Bob Rauschenberg Gallery at Florida SouthWestern State College (FSW) is opening an exhibition of the paintings and drawings of Wayne White, an internationally-acclaimed Los Angeles artist who won three Emmy Awards for designing sets and puppets from the late-80s children's show Pee-wee's Playhouse.

The exhibition opens Sept. 11 and runs through Nov. 7 at the gallery on the FSW Thomas Edison (Lee) Campus, 8099 College Parkway.

White will be an artist-in-residence at FSW for the week leading up to his opening. During that time he will work with students on creating a gigantic puppet/sculpture of the gallery's namesake, Bob Rauschenberg.

"I've always had the do-it-yourself approach," said White. "I grew up in this blue-collar family and didn't have a lot of

toys, so you had to make your own fun. Building forts out of sticks and scrap lumber – that's where I learned the joy of making something from nothing."

Besides his sculpture installation, White will also exhibit his iconic "Word Paintings" and a series of watercolors he produced during a 2013 residency at the Robert Rauschenberg Foundation Residency program on Captiva Island. When the exhibition opens at 6 p.m. Sept. 11 he will also deliver a live performance for guests.

White is known for creating the iconic *Pee-wee's Playhouse* characters Randy, Cool Cat, Chicky Baby and Dirty Dog. In 2012 he was the subject of a feature length documentary called *Beauty is Embarrassing* (directed by Neil Berkeley) and a 382-page hardbound monographic book (designed and edited by Todd Oldham), *Maybe Now I'll Get the Respect I So Richly Deserve*.

The artist insisted on naming the space the Bob Rauschenberg Gallery (versus the "Robert Rauschenberg Gallery") as it was consistent with the intimate, informal relationship he maintained with both the local Southwest Florida community and FSW.
